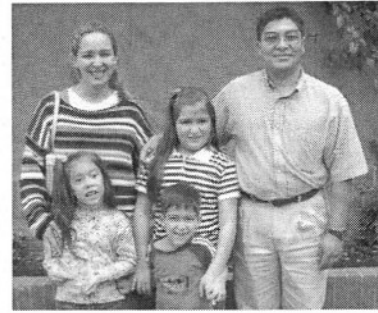

Beloved Brethren,

Greetings in the precious Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We hope that you are enjoying His rich blessings.

December 4th my wife and I traveled to Cuba to encourage the brethren there and also to have a seminar on discipleship and the family. My wife taught the women. It was really a blessing to see eight men make the decision to serve the Lord.

By the Lord's mercy a family gave us the money enabling us to travel to the United States. It was a blessing for my family and myself to spend a beautiful time with our church, Mission Blvd. Baptist Church in Fayetteville, Arkansas. We really enjoyed sharing with them. We were also able to visit some supporting churches and give a report of the work here in Colombia. In addition, I visited a couple of churches to present our ministry. May the Lord put in their hearts the desire to support us. Unfortunately the time was short because the children had to be back to start the new school year in the first days of February. During the trip, our son David had to be hospitalized in Columbus, Georgia. Our medical insurance covered part of the expense. We are waiting to receive the rest of the bills, but we are confident that God provides. Thanks to all those who welcomed us into their homes and to the pastors who so kindly received us in the churches. May the Lord bless you all.

Upon returning to Colombia we found ourselves with our batteries recharged and a more profound vision for the work. We thank the Lord that the congregation in Bogotá is growing and is increasingly solid spiritually. In Nocaima we were able to rent a meeting place and we are visiting and passing out literature door to door.

The correspondence school students continue to increase, to the point that the work in the jails has doubled. Praise the Lord! Brother Luis Enrique Castañeda is a great help in the jails and is taking over this ministry under my leadership.

Next week I will travel to a town called El Líbano, in the department of Tolima, to speak with the students and begin something there. They are wanting to start congregating. This town is four hours from the capital and the road is bad. There is not a highway to there.

God gave us a great blessing. I was invited to preach on the radio one day a week for eight weeks for twenty minutes per day. This will be a blessing and an opportunity to proclaim the Gospel in a country that each day is more mired in idolatry and false doctrine.

The project I have for June is to open a Bible institute in the building in Bogotá. We have correspondence students that want to learn more. It will be without cost to the students. I am preparing the materials with which to start. We also are waiting for the container of materials from the U.S. in order to start traveling throughout the whole country passing out tracts and Bible studies.

We want to present our ministry in other churches that might wish to support us, because this year the cost of mailing a study has risen by eighty cents per study, and inflation has affected our personal expenses also.
